A Message from our Minister

Growth - personal, spiritual growth - is very much a focus in our circuit this year. And as 2026 begins, many of us might be thinking about growth - what we hope will change, what we want to become, and what we want to leave behind. The Bible often uses the image of plants to describe our spiritual lives, and it's a helpful picture to hold as we step into the months ahead.

A healthy plant doesn't grow overnight. Growth happens quietly, beneath the surface, long before anything is visible. First, strong roots need to develop, drawing in water and nutrients day after day. In the same way, spiritual growth is rarely dramatic. It comes through small, faithful habits - daily prayer and Bible reading, worship, service, and learning to trust God more deeply in everyday circumstances.

Plants also need the right environment. They need light, nourishment, and care. Too little attention and they wither; too much pressure and they can be damaged. Our spiritual lives are similar. We grow best when we remain connected to God and to one another, allowing encouragement, accountability, and grace to shape us. Joining a Bible study or house group is an ideal environment for faith to grow.

Finally, growth takes patience. As any of you who are keen gardeners know, you cannot force a seed to sprout, but instead have to trust the process and keep tending the soil. As we enter this new year, let's resist the urge to rush our spiritual growth and instead, remain rooted in Christ, trusting that God is at work - even if we can't see the results yet.

“ Let your roots grow down into him and draw up nourishment from him. See that you go on growing in the Lord, and become strong and vigorous in the truth you were taught. ” (Colossians 2:7 Living Bible)

I pray that this year is one of steady, faithful growth for us all.

At our last November meeting on 26 November we were joined by Richard Luscombe telling us about **“An American at Wrest Park”**. This was a very enjoyable tale of Whitelaw Reid, an American who bought Wrest Park as a weekend retreat! He was originally a war correspondent during the years 1861-65 and was the first journalist to send his report by telegraph. He was a Vice President candidate, although not chosen for this role, he did become an American diplomat and newspaper editor and was also the author of ‘Ohio in the War’ – a popular work of history. In 1905 he became the US ambassador to the UK and was a real fan of the new trend of motor cars and allowed Wrest Park to host the Bedford Auto Club in 1907.

Our last meeting before our Christmas break was a very entertaining afternoon hosted by our resident musicians, Silas and Yvonne, on 10 December. All members of the ALG committee also took part with readings/prayers/poems and all guests enjoyed delicious party food, singing some favourite carols and enjoying friendly conversation, ending our year thanking God for giving us so much to be thankful for.

We start our next session on 4 February 2026 with a ‘welcome back’ musical afternoon with the Ukulele Players. We have our next programme arranged until 13 May and if you are interested in seeing a list of our speakers, please ask for a copy.
